Book Discussion Questions and Activities



- Have you ever been to the zoo?
- What animals do you think you would see at the zoo?
- Point out the names of each animal and where they come from.
- Take time to discuss new vocabulary:

Habitat – the place where an animal naturally lives.

Geography— the earth's features, people and places.

Primate— apes, monkeys and related animals.

Prehensile— being able to wrap around and hold tight.

Endangered— being in danger of disappearing.

Environment— climate, soil, and living things around you.

Intelligent – being able to learn and understand well.

Groomed-cleaned.

Captivity— kept in a cage or zoo.

Carnivores— animals that eat meat.

Monorail— a vehicle that rides on a track.

Herds- a group of animals of one kind.



Diet– food and drink that is regularly eaten.

Nutritionist – someone who studies foods for animals.

Mammal— animals with hair that nurse their young.

Poachers— one who kills animals illegally.

Illegally— doing something against the law.

Ivory – Material that animal tusks are made of.

Extinction– When animals disappear, no longer exist.

Marsupial— animals that carry their young in pouches.

Bamboo – a woody grass with hollow stems.

Aviaries— places to keep birds.

Nectar– sweet liquid inside some flowers.

Recycled- changed (cleaned) and used again.



Discussion Questions/Topics -

Read book once, and then again. On the second reading, let the child fill in the name of the animal.

Stop at each animal and ask child to describe it:

- What color is it?
- What is it doing?
- What else can that animal do?
- What makes this animal different from the others?

Activities to do together -

Find all the words that rhyme with "BACK" in the book. Notice how they have some of the same letters in them.

- Which animals in this book have you seen in your yard? At the zoo? At an aquarium?
- Which ones are your favorites? Why?

Activities to do together -

Make sounds of all the animals you can on each page.
